HEARTWORM CLINIC

March 10th will be the annual heartworm clinic at the Deer-Grove Vet Clinic, in Cottage Grove. The heartworm tests will run \$15.00 or \$20.00 for the snap test. Rabies and DHLPP will run \$15.00 and Bordetella will be \$14.00. Lyme and Corona are \$18.00 this year with Micro-chips at \$31.00. These are discounted prices and add up when you have several dogs to take care of. You can also get heartworm prescriptions written or pick up your heartworm medication at this time. This year I believe I saw a glimpse of a sleeping Flame on the news that night. "Gordon Setters, Flame and River" were even mentioned in the newspaper report on the Dog Fair the next day. We're moving up in the world!

News And Notes

Hello all my doggie friends. As most of you know, when Flint (Tartana Hit The Jackpot) was a year and a half old he was quite sick and we almost lost him after 10 days in ICU at the U of W Madison. After he recovered they gave us a fancy name of what they thought he may of had but no one ever was sure. Since that time, we have not given him any vaccinations except the required rabies one as they felt this sickness was an auto-immune sickness and he was over vaccinated even though the doses he was given were normal. Every so often we have had his blood titered to make sure he is considered vaccinated. Due to the strictness of the kennels over here in MN we recently had him titered and I thought you would all be interested to see his

results. It is quite baffling since he has not been vaccinated in over 10 years. I'll list what is considered "vaccinated", his results from 2000, and recent results so you can compare.

Canine Adenovirus (ICH)

The vast majority of vaccine titers range from 1:32-1:512. For animals below 1:16, a booster vaccination should be considered.

2000 results - POS 1:128

2006 results - POS 1:32

Canine Distemper Virus

The vast majority of vaccine titers range from 1:64-1:640. For animals below 1:32, a booster vaccination should be considered.

2000 results - POS 1:6144

2006 results - POS 1:2048

Canine Parvovirus HAI/2-ME

The vast majority of vaccine titers range from 1:160-1:640. For animals below 1:80, a booster vaccination should be considered.

2000 results - POS 1:1280

2006 results - POS 1:320

In the last 6 years his numbers have declined greatly but he is still considered vaccinated. I am happy to say, whatever he had has never come back over the years and he continues to be a happy, healthy, medicine free Gordon that will turn 12 in March.

Recognizing A Stroke

STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

During a BBQ, a friend stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) and just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes. They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food - while she appeared a bit shaken up, Ingrid went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening.

Ingrid's husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00pm, Ingrid passed away.) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps Ingrid would be with us today. Some don't die. They end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead. It only takes a minute to read this...

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Thank God for the sense to remember the "3" steps, **STR**. Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify.

Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S *Ask the individual to **SMILE**.

T *Ask the person to **TALK**, to SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently: It is sunny out today.)

R *Ask him or her to **RAISE BOTH ARMS**.

{NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out their tongue... if the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke}

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call 9-1-1 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

A cardiologist says if everyone who gets this e-mail sends it to 10 people; you can bet that at least one life will be saved.
